- 2. **Course Description:** For art or physical education majors seeking 12 grade certification. Explores elementary curriculum, the role of special teachers, problems of individual learners, functions of the entire school community.

### 4. Student Learning Outcomes:

Following satisfactory completion of course, the student will be able to:

- i. Demonstrate understanding of the interaction of learner characteristics, the learning process, and product.
- ii. Demonstrate knowledge of scheduling and classroom management strategies.

### 5. Course Evaluation:

Each activity (e.g., critiques, presentations, examinations, writings) will be assigned a numerical value. Grades are based upon the <u>cumulative point value</u> of all assignments and examinations.

Homework assignments are to be turned in when due. Failure to do so will result in a reduction of 2 points for each day it is late. After 5 days tests and/or homework <u>cannot</u> be

made up (without a doctor's excuse). Examinations <u>must</u> be taken at the announced time. Exams can be made up within five days <u>only</u> with the presentation of a doctor's excuse. Final examinations will be given <u>as scheduled</u> by the university.

All written work must be submitted in Standard English. English usage will be considered in course work evaluation, in accordance with EKU policy.

### 6. Student Progress:

Before the last day to withdraw from the course, students will have received grades on a reaction to an article, two critiques, one examination and a lesson plan.

### 7. Attendance Policy:

Absences equating 20% of class meetings will result in automatic failure. Class sessions missed as a result of late entry into the class will be counted as absences. The student is responsible for presenting the instructor with a reason for absences in order to be given opportunity to make up missed work. Adequate reasons for class absences include personal illness, death or serious illness in the immediate family, or participation in an approved University activity. Being late for class three (3) times will constitute an unexcused absence.
